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1 WELCOME

Thank you for visiting the Online Corral! The Online Corral is geared toward increasing the number of wild horses and burros placed into private care each year. The website replaced a 15-year-old system, the Online Corral has a streamlined interface that enables you to find your desired wild horse or burro more easily, including animal gallery filtering features and an interactive web map. In addition, you can submit and track the status of their applications directly through the website.

2 OVERVIEW

Qualified adopters must meet standard requirements for owning and caring for a wild horse and burro, including specific facility parameters and shelters to ensure the safety and health of the animals. In general, when adopting or purchasing an animal at an internet event, prospective adopters or purchasers should follow the steps outlined below.

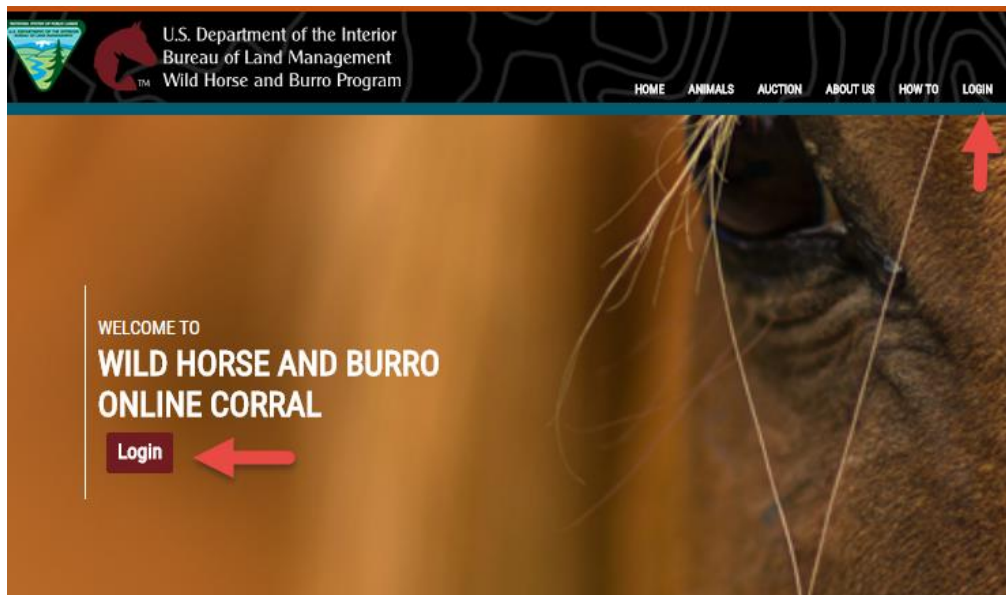
1. **Apply:** Create an Online Corral Profile, complete an application, and submit it for review.
2. **Bid:** Once the BLM approves your application, you are eligible to adopt or purchase your very own wild horse or burro. You may bid on the number of animals you are approved to adopt or purchase. The individual animal page from the gallery will display purchase methods and the current bid information. You can increase the current bid from \$5 to \$250 with each new bid. You may raise your own bid at any time. Proxy bidding allows the system to bid for you. Proxy bidding will automatically raise your bid (by \$5) up to your maximum, every time your high bid is challenged. Bidders can raise their maximum bid throughout the bidding process.
3. **Finalize:** Submit payment, select your preferred pick-up option, and finalize all Private Care and Maintenance Agreements or Bills of Sales within four calendar days.
4. **Pick up:** Pick up of your newly adopted or purchased wild horse or burro directly from the off-range corral or a satellite event. Bring a valid photo identification card, such as a driver's license to the event. You do NOT have to accept the animal if the animal does not meet your expectations. There is no penalty for not taking the animal. If you decline the animal in person, you may request a credit towards a future adoption. The BLM will load your animal into an approved trailer, please bring a halter if you wish to have your animal haltered prior to bringing them home.
5. **Bring Home your Wild Horses and Burros:** Unload your animal directly into your corral and shelter. Give your horse or burro time to adjust and become accustomed to their new surroundings. Call 1-800-370-3936 or email blm_es_inet_adoption@blm.gov with any questions or for assistance.

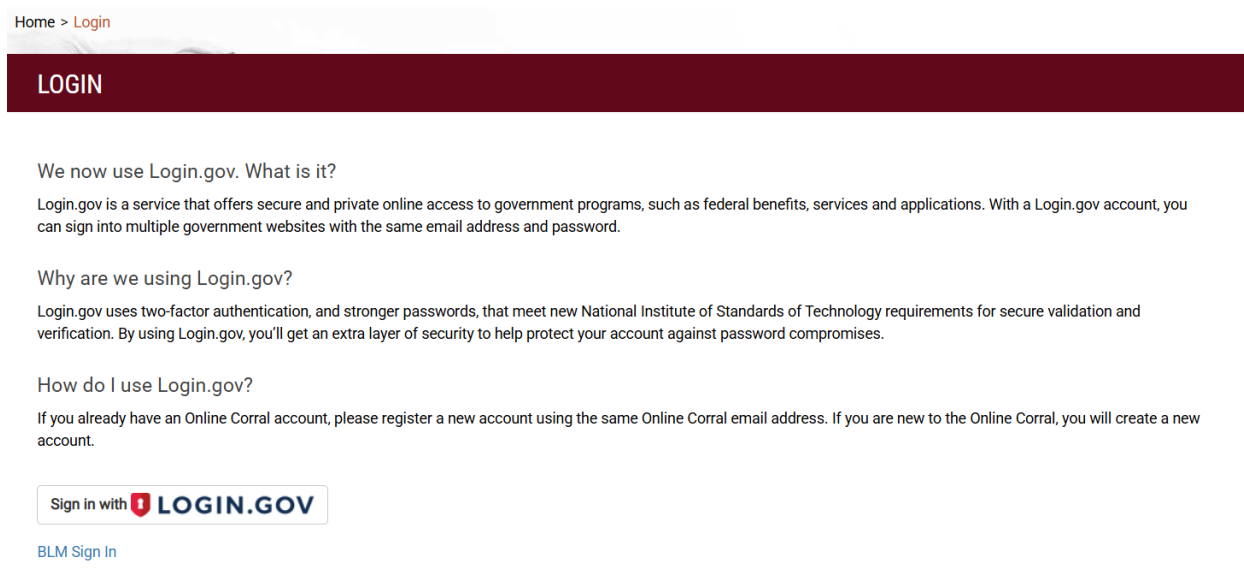

 (d) Adopters must make animals available for physical inspection within 7 days of receipt of a written request by the BLM;
 (e) Adopters must notify the BLM within 7 days of discovery of an animal's death, theft or escape;
 (f) Adopters must notify the BLM within 30 days of any change in the adopter's address;
 (g) Adopters must dispose of remains in accordance with applicable sanitation laws; and


Failure to comply with these terms may result in the cancellation of the agreement, repossession of the animals, and disapproval of requests for adoption of additional animals. In addition, violation of any term of a Private Maintenance and Care Agreement is a prohibited act.

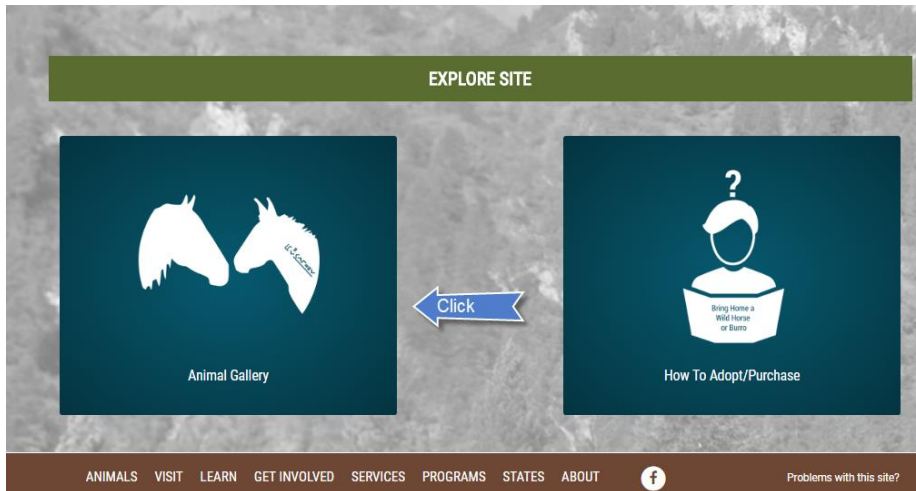

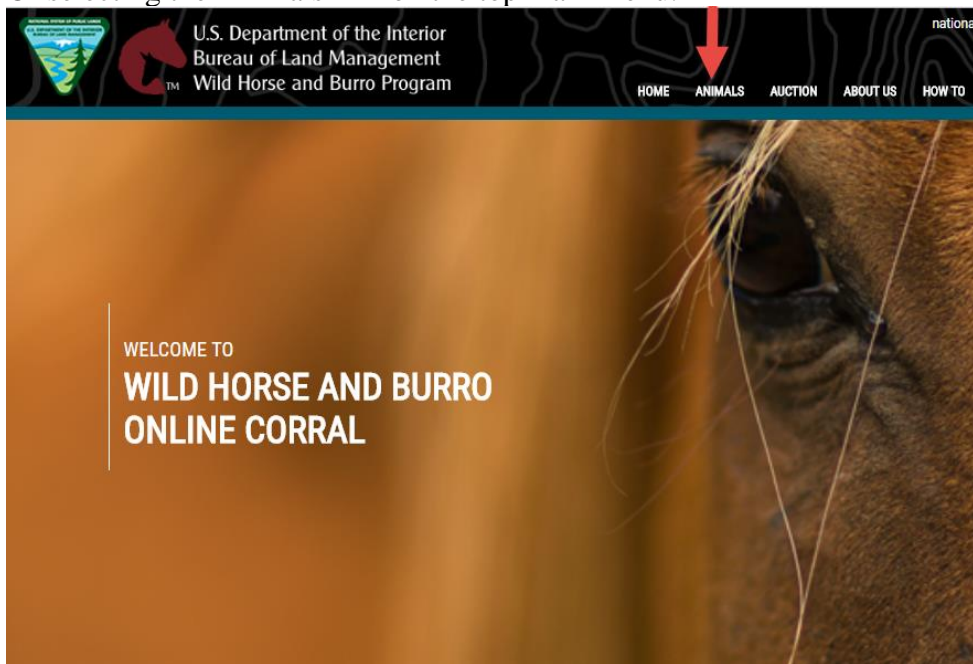
6 SEARCHING FOR AN ANIMAL

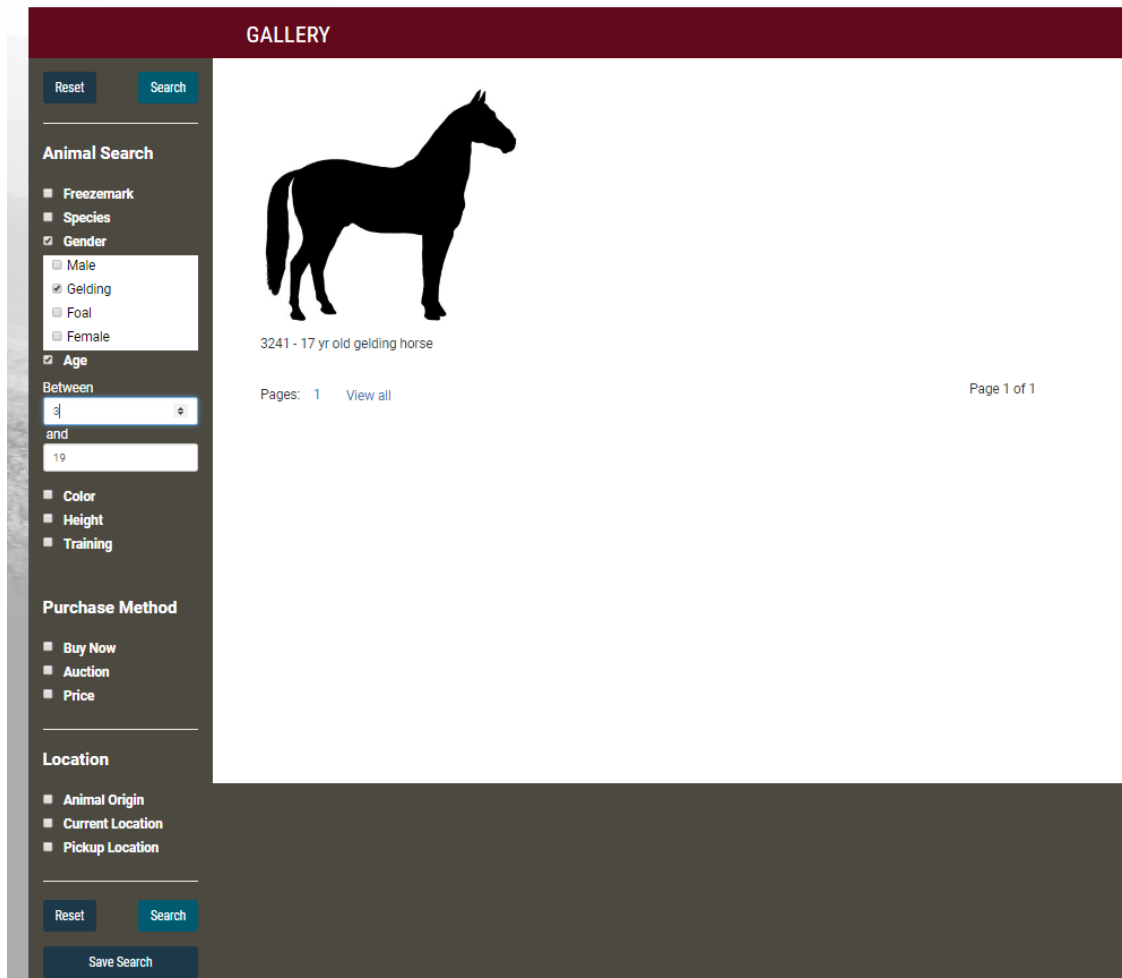
You can search for animals at any time, to bid or purchase an animal you will **log in, fill out an application and receive approval** to adopt or purchase.

You can view the animal gallery by either selecting the Animal Gallery button on the homepage:



Or selecting the Animals link on the top main menu.





This page is used to search for available animals to adopt or purchase. Search facets will only display the information related to the animals published on the Online Corral.

There are three ways in which the search can be filtered. Multiple search criteria checkboxes can be selected at the same time to narrow down the search. Once you have selected all desired facets you must click the "Search" button to filter the gallery view. The "Reset" button will remove all facet selections. There are two buttons "Back" and "Next" that will page through the filtered animal listings.

6.1 Animal Search

- **Freezemark** – You can input a minimum of 4 digits of the animal freezemark.
- **Species** – Select from one of two choices, Horses or Burros.
- **Gender** – Select from multiple choices: Female, Gelding and Male.
- **Age** – Select from a range of ages. Add the minimum age in the top field and your maximum age in the bottom field.
- **Color** –Select as many colors as you wish from the dropdown menu.

- **Height** – Select a range of heights from 10 hands to 20 Hands. Add your minimum height number in the top field and the maximum height in the bottom field.
- **Training** – Select from four choices, Halter, Saddle, Untrained or Incomplete.
- **Disposition** – Select animals that are Eligible for Adoption or Eligible for Sale.

Eligible or Adoption-Qualified adopters must meet standard requirements for owning and caring for a wild horse and burro, including specific facility parameters to ensure the safety and health of the animals. Adopting an animal means the wild horse or burro belongs to the federal government until the BLM issues you a Certificate of Title. After you have had the adopted animal for one year, the BLM will send you a Title Eligibility Letter. You must obtain a signed statement from a qualified person (such as a veterinarian, county extension agent, or humane official) verifying that you have provided humane care and treatment for your adopted animal. Once you sign and return the Title Eligibility Letter, the BLM will mail the Certificate of Title to you. After you receive the Certificate of Title, the animal becomes your private property.

Eligible for Sale-Wild horses and burros more than 10 years old – as well as younger animals that have been offered for adoption at least three times – are eligible for sale. Purchasing a wild horse or burro means that ownership of the animal passes immediately from the federal government to the buyer.

- **Video** – Select animals that have videos published to their individual animal pages.

6.2 Purchase Method


- **Adopt or Buy Now** – See all animals being sold at a fixed price.
- **Auction** – See all animals currently listed in an auction.
- **Price** – You can set your min price and max price this will give you all animals currently listed in that price range.

6.3 Location

- **Animal Origin** – A dropdown will appear with multiple herd management areas and off-range locations. You can select as many choices as desired to filter.
- **Current Location** – A dropdown will appear with locations where available animals are currently located. You can select as many choices as desired to filter.
- **Pickup by Zip Code** – See a field to add a valid zip code. Next you will have to select 50 miles, 100 miles, 250 miles or 500 miles for distance from that zip code.
- **Pickup Location List** – See a list with available pickup locations. You can select as many choices as desired.

6.4 Saved Search

This feature will only show for logged in users - Will save the facets selected to run the same search at a future time, you will receive an email notification with animals matching your search criteria.



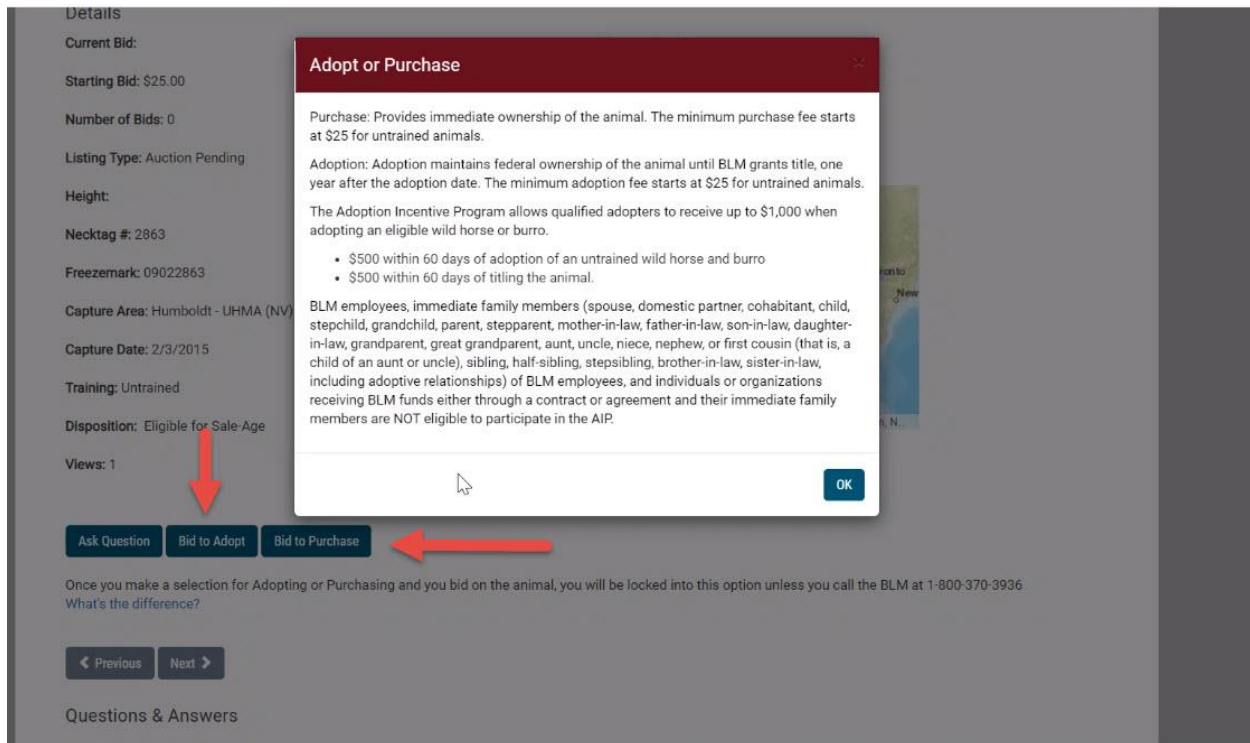

7 BIDDING OR BUYING A FIXED PRICE

You will only be able to bid to purchase or bid to adopt based on your approved and current applications and the animal's disposition, whether they are sale eligible or only eligible for adoption.

7.1 Auction

The animal can be bid on by many interested parties until the auction ends. The Bid to Adopt or Bid to Purchase buttons will be visible depending upon the animal's disposition.



There are 2 types of listings:

7.1.1 Bid to Adopt

Qualified adopters must meet standard requirements for owning and caring for a wild horse and burro, including specific facility parameters to ensure the safety and health of the animals. Adopting an animal means the wild horse or burro belongs to the federal government until the BLM issues you a Certificate of Title. After you have had the adopted animal for one year, the BLM will send you a Title Eligibility Letter. You must obtain a signed statement from a qualified person (such as a veterinarian, county extension agent, or humane official) verifying that you have provided humane care and treatment for your adopted animal. Once you sign and return the Title Eligibility Letter, the BLM will mail the Certificate of Title to you. After you receive the Certificate of Title, the animal becomes your private property.

7.1.2 Bid to Purchase

Bid to purchase will only be available on wild horses and burros more than 10 years old – as well as younger animals that have been offered for adoption at least three times. Purchasing a wild horse or burro means that ownership of the animal passes immediately from the federal government to the buyer.

The Online Corral will notify you if you are not eligible to bid on the animal you have selected.

7.2 Proxy Bid

You can *proxy bid* on any auction – this means you can set a high bid for an animal and the system will continue to bid in \$5.00 increments on your behalf until your high bid amount is reached. For example – an animal is currently showing a bid amount of \$200.00 and you set your high bid to bid \$300.00. Your new bid will show \$205.00. If another user decides to bid \$250.00, your proxy bid will show \$255.00. The proxy bid will continue until it reaches the \$300.00 limit.

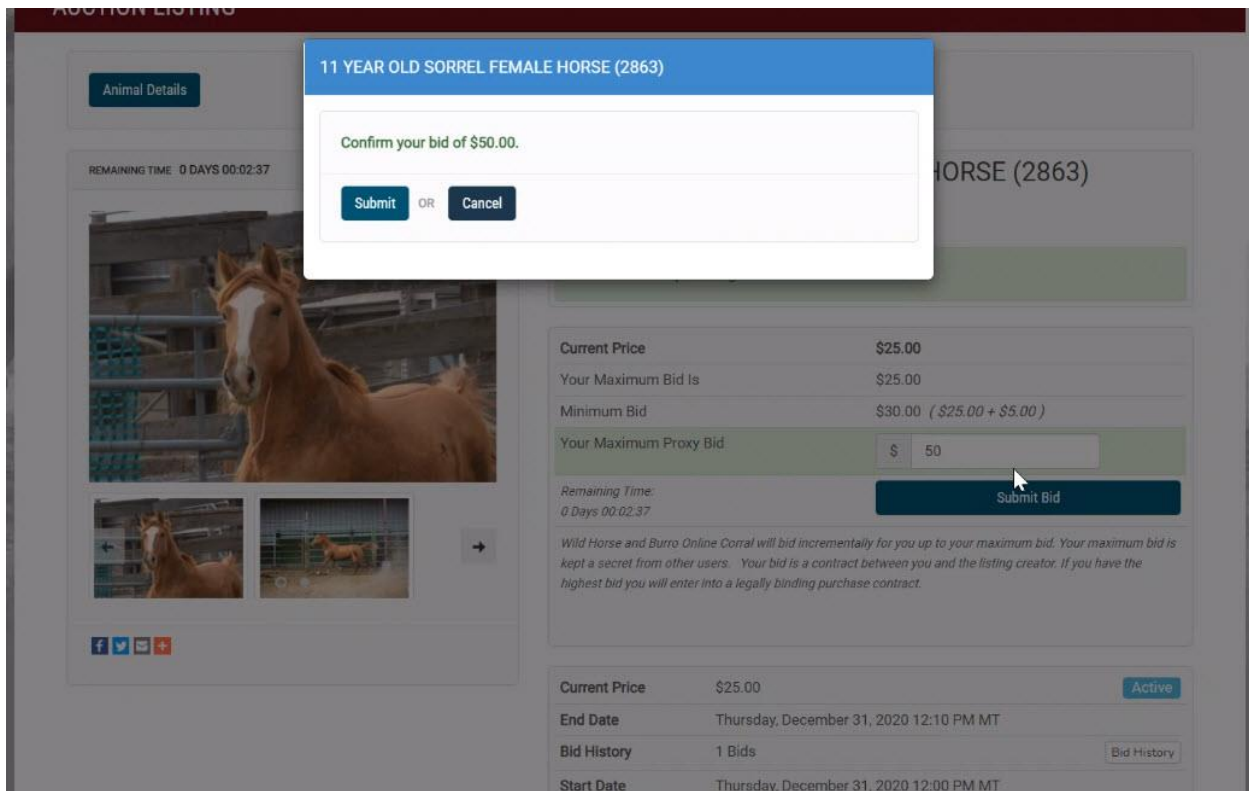

7.3 Fixed Price

The animal is listed at one price and there is no bidding – whoever selects the Adopt or Buy Now option will need to pay in full the listed fixed price.

7.4 Bid Cancellation

To cancel a bid, email blm_es_inet_adoption@blm.gov, with your username and the animal's freemark. The Online Corral administrators will cancel your bid and you will then be able to bid on other animals.

7.5 Bidding Integrity


Users found placing bids on animals with the intent to artificially increase their price or desirability or repeatedly passing on the animal will be subject to a range of actions, including limits on your bidding privileges and suspension of your Online Corral account.

8 FINALIZING ADOPTION OR PURCHASE

At the end of the auction the Online Corral will notify you if you are the high bidder. The email notification contains a link that starts your checkout process. You must select your pickup location, pay for the animal, and electronically sign the Private Maintenance and Care Agreement or Bill of Sale within four calendar days to finalize the adoption or purchase of your wild horse or burro.

You may elect to pass on the animal if you are unable to proceed with the adoption or purchase.

11 PAY ADOPTION OR PURCHASE FEES

Once you have won an auction animal or decided to participate in a Fixed Price listing – the next process is to checkout and pay the fees associated with adopting or purchasing the selected animal.



You can split the **full** payment amount between 2 payment methods – for example:

- 2 credit cards
- 1 credit card and 1 Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT)
- 2 EFTs

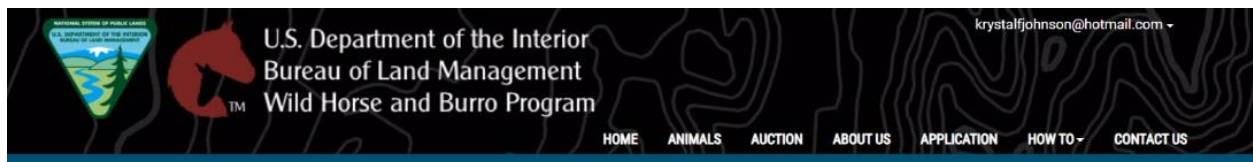

Once you have completed all the Online Corral steps you will receive an email with pickup location specifics, it generally takes 10-14 days to complete all the Online Corral steps for all event participants once the bidding ends.

Pick up of your newly adopted or purchased wild horse or burro directly from the off-range corral or a satellite event. Bring a valid photo identification card, such as a driver's license to the event. You do NOT have to accept the animal if the animal does not meet your expectations. There is no penalty for not taking the animal. If you decline the animal in person, you may request a credit towards a future adoption.

The BLM will load your animal into an approved trailer, please bring a halter if you wish to have your animal haltered prior to bringing them home.

Unload your animal directly into your corral and shelter. Give your horse or burro time to adjust and become accustomed to their new surroundings. Please review the [Care and Feed Guide](#) created by the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) Wild Horse and Burro Program as a resource for adopters and purchasers who have taken home a wild horse and/or burro.
